

BACKGROUND

Young people are leaving Christianity at an unprecedented rate. How can believers better understand, relate to, equip, and train our youth? This talk explores why young people are leaving the church and encourages Christians to respond with reasonable explanations to challenges while developing authentic relationships with people. Jon offers five practical ways to help the next generation see that Christianity is the true story of reality. He discusses the difference between teaching and training, and encourages inoculation versus isolation.

SESSION TWO: 10:45 to Noon, During the Christian Formation Hour in the B1 Main Sanctuary

Hello, My Name Is: Atheist

In this interactive role-play, Jon puts on the hat of an atheist and presents the top five reasons not to believe in God. Having been an atheist for more than 25 years, Jon brings a conversation that is very convincing and often proves to be a great way to introduce an apologetic series. The aim of the discussion is to show the participants their misunderstandings of atheism, and to help them learn why they believe, not just what they believe, thus highlighting the need for apologetics. This has proved to be a great eye-opener for students and adults.

We live in a relativistic world, one in which truth has become secondary to feelings and pleasure. He then offers some tools that help others see what's wrong with relativism, and why it doesn't accurately reflect the world around us.
