Message: "Do You Know the Song of Moses?"

Scripture: Revelation 15:1-4 (02-23-25 Pastor Tony Hao)

Before we looking at Rev 15, important to remember what just happened in Exodus 14. Moses just led the people of Israel out of Egypt. Soon they found themselves between the Red Sea and the Egyptians behind them. It was then God parted the sea so the people can cross. That's not all, the pursuing Egyptians were drowned when the waters came back over them. In the Old Testament, this event is the greatest example of God and His power: how He saves His people, and destroys their enemies. In Revelation 15, notice John heard it's a song of Moses and of the Lamb. It's about Jesus, and for Jesus.

The first part of the song reminds us of God's actions. What God does is miraculous, awe-inspiring, and mighty. Furthermore, they happen in a way that is righteous and faithful. What God does flows from who He is: the sovereign, all-powerful, faithful ruler of the universe who will judge and save.

This last part of the song celebrates God's uniqueness. There is no one like God. He alone is holy and righteous. He alone is worthy of glory and reverence. No one else can do what He does. He will call every soul to account. No one else is worthy of his glory. The only proper response is to fear Him.

Worship that is God-centered allows us to celebrate aspects of His character, and encourages us to live for Him, and be more like Him. How often our worship turns inward and loses its power, or turns outward and loses its focus.

GROWING DEEPER (Reflection & Application)

- 1. What is your favorite song? What makes it special? Is it a song you can sing in the good times, and the hard times?
- 2. How does this passage make you feel? What does it make you want to do? Why? What has surprised you about God and what He had done?
- 3. Is your worship God-centered and Christ-centered? Does it celebrate aspects of His character and encourages you to live for Him, and be more like Him?
